Deerfield Storm Water Plan:

Christine Fetten reviewed history and then discussed specifics of proposal with Pio Lombardo

- -157 acre watershed, 13 distinct watersheds in area of Mill Pond
- 54 pre-existing structures identified that need to be cleaned
- -Additional French drains, chambers "storm tech" and catch basins proposed. All will be installed underground or in the right of way
- -9,200 sq. ft. in pavement reconfiguring proposed to get water off of road and into drains before it hits the pond
- -2 permeable reactive barriers adjacent to the headwall proposed. Needs DEC permit. Can be installed at later date if permit takes too long.
- -Discussed cleaning of existing drains and 5-year maintenance plan linked to contract and cost to maintain after the 5 years.
- -Grant money and town matching funds will be used to cover cost -- version one estimated at \$771,000, version two estimated at \$1.14 million
- -Additional grant money opportunities exist and will be explored
- -Potential for CPF/water quality funds to be used (although initial projects will probably go to septics)
- -Vinoly rain garden not deemed necessary with this plan
- -Timeline would be: 1) Work session, 2) Town Board vote, 3) Bid process, 4) April start date and mid July completion.
- -Note: Since our meeting, a work session was held and concerns were raised by Alex Gregor. All parties agreed to meet within the next few weeks to discuss concerns.

September 2016 Minutes were approved.
